CURRICULUM DESIGN:

1. KINDERGARTEN: LEARNING THROUGH PLAY

As Maria Montessori stated 'Play is the work of a child'. At the kindergarten level we have designed our curriculum for the preschoolers emphasizing the play-way method of learning.

At this level we focus on encouraging children to come to school with joy rather than out of compulsion. Playing different games with the students is one the most effective methods to teach and develop their fine and gross motor skills, language, social behavior, personal awareness, emotional well-being, creativity, problem solving and learning ability.

We ensure that our students have experience with a wide variety of content be it art, music, language, environmental science, mathematics, and social relations because each is important for the development of a complex and integrated brain. We encourage students to learn alphabets in the ease of writing letters according to its form rather than the routine A-Z. We train teachers to use digital boards through which letters, numbers, rhymes, stories, songs, phonetic sounds can be taught to our students.

Along with the chalk-board, paper-pencil methods, also play dough, water colors, playing with ball, sand, pebbles, sticks, beads, dice, blocks and various other methods are used for better teaching-learning experience. The phonetic sounds of the letters of the English alphabet are taught for better word building. The teachers extensively use picture reading to help the students grasp new concepts and develop the student's listening and speaking ability. Upon completing Kindergarten, all our students are able to communicate effectively.

Both vocal and instrumental music, dance, art and craft and sports is integrated along with the syllabus in kindergarten. Students are encouraged to participate in various stage events. We believe these co-curricular activities sharpen the student's mind and are a means of developing confidence and learning acceptable behavioral patterns.

Homework is given on weekends, however activity sheets are completed daily in the class to complement the text book and reinforce each lesson. Also there is no examination rule for the nursery and lower kindergarten section. There is nil to less bag weight in Kindergarten level.

2. PRIMARY LEVEL: INTERACTIVE METHODS OF GROWING

Every child is an artist' rightly said by Picasso. To identify and develop the potential of our students is the objective of our curriculum at primary level. Students at this level are able to imagine and talk more. This adds as an advantage to explore their minds.

At this level, we can continue to teach our students through play, but especially to learn and grow together as a team. Teachers use their understanding of the students' growth and development stages and to appropriately encourage, mentor, praise, and guide their students.

Between classes one to four, we emphasize on conversational skills, phonetics, reading ability, spelling, cursive writing skills, teachers begin to show the students the use of dictionary and mental mathematics. Hindi and Bangla are also taught at this level. The creativity of each student is developed and nurtured through various extra-curricular activities. Physical Education and Mass PT School happens every day along with assembly and also as a important subject in curriculum. We have allocated a day in a week for extra curricular activities where in students can choose to participate in one of the various offering such as gymnastics – cum sports complex, cricket, football, badminton, abacus, chess, basketball, table tennis, karate, dance, vocal and instrumental music, drawing or photography. Students are also encouraged to participate in various stage events that happens every month to develop their self direction and stage confidence.

Worksheets and activities based on each lesson taught are given to the students upon chapter completion. This ensures adequate extra practice and enables the students to grasp the topics better. Thus, notebooks and textbooks are not only the source of learning but the student further explores the topic with the help of their parents to understand the chapter better. Teamwork is encouraged through games and projects. Students are also encouraged to complete projects in the classroom under the teacher's supervision. Digital boards are also used to bring the topics to life and enhance learning. Nature walks, teaching in amphitheatre and learning through play adds interest and joy in learning. Students gain practical experience through outdoor activities related to environmental science, computer science labs, and regular use of science, language and social science laboratories. Library periods help students to develop their imagination, story-telling, listening and reading and writing abilities. Homework is planned in such a way as to minimize the bag weight.

Value Education is a very important part of our curriculum. Values are taught through songs, drama, drawing, and poetry writing. Classroom discussion about their real life experiences and maintaining a journal help the students to apply these values. A school counselor is also available for students to discuss any important issues with students and parents.

Assessment is based on submission of assignments, projects, neatness of notebooks, classroom behavior, and written and oral forms of examination. Worksheets and activities form a part of homework. Students facing difficulty in any subject are given remedial lessons.

A day at the primary level always begins and ends with a prayer. Prayers are an effort on the part of the teachers to bring these children to trust in Supreme One. We desire that that parents understand and support our teaching methodology so that they can guide their children along similar lines.

3. MIDDLE SCHOOL: PROACTIVE STEPS FOR LIFE

'Teaching a middle school is more like an adventure than a job! 'Said someone.

There is a paradigm shift in the curriculum as well as in the teaching-learning process for our students in the Middle school level from classes five to eight. Understanding the difference in the physical and psychological development of both boys and girls, the teachers are trained to handle the students who move into the adolescence period.

Teachers use various techniques to boost the vertical learning curve. Teachers and students explain and learn concepts through digital board and Power Point presentations. Students are taken to separate laboratories for various subjects such as Computer, English, Social Science, Physics, Chemistry and Biology. Library periods are a time to develop their reading, writing and listening skills. By the time a student reaches middle school he/she is will be using a dictionary regularly.

Students are also encouraged to perform role-plays, group discussion, make projects, grasp the practical knowledge of the subject and express creativity through prose and poetry pieces. Concepts taught in class are reinforced through activity sheets and question banks prepared by teachers. Teachers assign projects based on the chapter which require students to explore the world of internet to find more information. This helps students to be updated and informed. All aspects of the learning experience are geared towards preparing students for competitive exams at the next level.

Value Education is given as much importance as other subjects. Students are frequently asked to reflect on situations and events in their daily lives to develop their values and attitudes. Teachers also encourage students to write a daily journal to develop their thinking and creative writing abilities.

The creativity and personality of each student is further developed through various extra-curricular activities. Physical Education and Mass PT School happens every day along with assembly and also as an important subject in curriculum. We have allocated a day in a week for exclusive extra-curricular activities where in students can choose to participate in one of the various offering such as gymnastics – cum sports complex, cricket, football, badminton, abacus, chess, basketball, table tennis, karate, dance, vocal and instrumental music, drawing or photography. Students are also encouraged to participate in various stage events that develop their self direction and stage confidence.

Assessment is based on assignments, projects, teamwork, group discussion, written and practical examinations, neatness, and classroom behavior. Students facing difficulty in any subject are given remedial work.

We recognize that students in middle school undergo great conflict within themselves due to the changes in their body and mind. Conflicts with family and peers are not uncommon during this phase. A school counselor is available to help students accept themselves in this phase and provide necessary guidance to both them and their parents.

Prayers are an important part in dealing with all kinds of situations, be it joyous or trying.

4. SECONDARY LEVEL: FACING AN OUTSIDE WORLD.

There is a makeover in the methods of the teaching-learning process for our students in the Secondary school level, as we understand the difference in the physical and psychological development of both boys and girls, the teachers are continuously trained to handle the students who are in the adolescence period along with the preparation of board exams and viewing the world outside in a broader perspective.

It is very important to make students of this age about the ability to avoid risky behaviour like smoking, drugs, premarital sex, addictions etc. but channelizing their minds and energy to enjoy regular and active physical exercise/sports/games/meditation/music/art etc.

To understand that each of them have their own special talents and accept weaknesses. And at the same time to respect other's talents and weaknesses. Students are given opportunities to explore and respect own rights and responsibilities in class, at home and during conflict situations/or other episodes. Expression of own opinions, ideas and perceptions without offending others.

Among this group of students it is important that they are aware of the importance of adopting positive attitudes, values and behavior. Conscious of the rationale to follow rules and disciplinary practices and know the importance of expressing gratitude and respect for school, teachers and staff. The students are made comfortable to discuss personal concerns regarding home, achievements with teachers, also their own aspirations, fears, weakness and seek help and support from others.

They are made conscious of personal responsibility for resolving conflicts with others, willing to join in school initiatives to help poor and needy students in school and community. Accept responsibility for peers and junior students as well as classmates.

Teachers use various techniques to boost the vertical learning curve. Teachers and students explain and learn concepts through digital board and Power Point presentations. Students are taken to separate laboratories for various subjects such as Computer, English, Social Science, Physics, Chemistry and Biology. Library periods are a time to develop their reading and listening skills. By the time a student reaches secondary school he/she is expert in using a dictionary regularly.

Students are also encouraged to perform role-plays, carry out small scale surveys, make projects, conduct debates, group discussion, grasp the practical knowledge of the subject, read journals and articles and explain their view and contrast the view of other students, express creativity through prose and poetry pieces. Concepts taught in class are reinforced through activity sheets and question banks prepared by teachers. Teachers assign projects based on the chapter which require students to explore the world of internet to find more information. This helps students to be updated and informed. All aspects of the learning experience are geared towards preparing students for competitive exams at the next level.

Counseling is given to parents along with the students as they prepare their students for the board exams and assessing the aptitudes of their own students. Mental health and physical health is given priority as these students must be fit and active.

Students are taught the importance of water harvesting to conserve water. Special assembly, essay writing, drawing are also conducted on water conservation and rain harvesting. Taking care of environment also includes waste management. Students are taught about wet and dry waste. As a part of assignment, they all have to make dustbins and taught to practice this at home and in school. Waste segregation is taught from class Nursery. They are taught to pick up bits of paper, food waste from their own tiffin boxes, use of newspaper and paper bags, cloth bags instead of plastic bags. As students grow, they are able to share the message of environmental protection and its hazards if not cared, through fancy dress, group talks, cleaning campaigns in school, discussion and reports from news around the world.

Hebron School is using energy saving and energy efficient electrical equipment. School has solar panels for energy efficacy. Teachers are very observant and strict about maintaining cleanliness of the school at all times and this is inculcated from a very tender age. Our parents also cooperate in that regard inorder to maintain the school regulations for cleanliness and protection of our environment.


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CONCLUSION:
